
Ranked-Choice Voting makes it harder to vote, harder to count the votes, and much harder to ensure a transparent and accountable democratic process.

WHAT IS RCV

RCV fundamentally changes elections, with voters ranking multiple candidates. Those who favor unpopular candidates may have their second, third, or even lower rankings counted. Those who do not rank all candidates can have their ballots thrown out.

WHY IT'S DANGEROUS

RCV makes elections more complicated, less transparent, and harder to trust. An MIT study "found that RCV produced significantly lower levels of voter confidence, voter satisfaction, and ease of use," and that campaigns became more negative with RCV.

RCV MEASURES ARE BANKROLLED BY LIBERAL DARK MONEY

Most funding for RCV measures comes from three **left-leaning** billionaires: <u>John</u> <u>Arnold</u>, <u>Katherine Gehl</u>, and <u>Kathryn Murdoch</u>.

- After Enron paid John Arnold an \$8 million <u>bonus</u>, he started a hedge fund and made billions. He now pushes RCV, including **at least \$18.6 million on ballot measures**.
- Katherine Gehl sold the family's nacho cheese empire and began pushing jungle primaries and RCV. She lives in Chicago, but personally gave at least \$6 million to push <u>Nevada Question 3.</u>
- Kathryn Murdoch promised to give more than \$100 million to push RCV, mostly through her group, Unite America. The New Yorker gave \$2.5 million to an <u>RCV measure</u> that failed in Massachusetts in 2020.

Other RCV funding comes from the left's shadowy dark-money network:

- Arabella Advisors ("the left's dark-money manager");
- FairVote (a network of leftist election activists);
- The Hewlett Foundation ("liberal mega-funder"); and
- Open Society Foundation (George Soros).
